The Calumet EC Pilot Program is a **two-year** training program that aims to introduce and train new professionals for careers in community-based conservation. Crew members are expected to commit to the **entire two-year program**, which will include job readiness training, paid certification opportunities and a 1-3 month long externship with a partner organization. Successful candidates will have a strong desire to start their careers in the environmental field, showing a passion for advancing our conservation goals through our community-focused approach to engaging communities in the Calumet Region.

Responsibilities:

- Collaborate on a team of 5 to work on implementing engagement projects in the Forest Preserves of Cook County
- Assist with in-person engagement and stewardship programs/activities in the forest preserves, eventually designing and implementing own programs
- Assist with in-person outreach and create engaging digital and printed communications
- Participate in required training sessions during the two-year program
- Compile photos, anecdotal data, and other materials for an end-of-project portfolio

- Must be 21 years or older
- Willingness and available to commit to the two-year training program
