**Summary:** The Program Assistant will assist in the preparation, management, implementation, and reporting of the Forest Preserve Experience Program under the supervision of the Program Manager. FPE is a five-week summer program for teens, focused on job skill development, restoration training and work, environmental education, and exposure to the forest preserves and jobs in conservation. Successful candidates will have strong communication and organizational skills, be able to work in a fast-paced environment, and engage with high school students and adult crew leaders.

### Duties:

- Support administrative tasks related to participant recruitment, hiring, and management.
- Support crew leaders with daily needs of the program, including transportation coordination, equipment, conflict management and administrative tasks.
- In coordination with partners, ensure smooth execution of environmental education and experience days.
- Fill in for crew leaders as needed during the course of the five-week program.
